## Panel 2: Financing New Nuclear and How Investment Decisions Are Made

This session will survey anticipated costs for new nuclear plants and will discuss first-of-a-kind (FOAK) and nth-of-a-kind (NOAK) projects, federal funding, and the state policies and programs needed to support new builds. The presenters will also discuss risk management and milestones for investment decisions as projects are developed.

### Topics include:

- Capital cost drivers (construction, financing, supply chain, labor)
- Operating cost drivers (fuel cycle, O&M, regulatory compliance)
- FOAK projects and budget concerns, and how NOAK curves change the math
- The role of risk allocation among ratepayers, developers, and federal support
- Federal financing tools: Loan Program Office and Energy Dominance Finance Office

## Keynote Address: View from the Sherrill Administration

The Sherrill Administration has taken a bold step to evaluate new nuclear build in New Jersey. This new effort will need to address many policy drivers and financial conditions to support new building opportunities in the state. Senior officials from the Sherrill Administration will discuss the Governor's policy position and the specifics of the evaluation process. They will also address how to support new nuclear build and structure a program authorized under the NJ Power Act, legislation signed by Governor Sherrill in July 2026.

- Process and timetable for the program at the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) and the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA)
- Issues the Administration will evaluate
- Anticipated proposals
- Whether additional legislation or funding is needed
